

Anti-Bullying Week



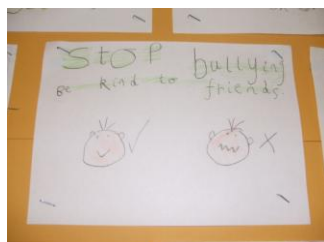
From 16 -20 November was Anti-Bullying Week in school. Throughout the week children throughout school were involved in activities to raise awareness about what forms of bullying there are and what we can all do about it. Y3 made a superb book covering all aspects of bullying. They did some 'hot seating' and role play about how they would help someone who was being bullied. They made their friends smile by sending kind messages through email.



Y4 drew some colourful posters about the dangers of cyber-bullying which was the theme of the Anti-Bullying Alliance campaign this year. Children learned about how to stay safe on the internet and what to do if they received any nasty phone messages.



.Reception/ Year 1 read a story about bullying. As a class, they then made a list of anti-bullying messages. Each child chose one of the messages to write on a brick. The bricks were put together to build a wall against bullying. Children also drew around their hands and on each finger they wrote the name of somebody that they could trust if they were worried about bullying.



Throughout the week, the children filled in questionnaires to find out how well our school is preventing and dealing with bullying. Children also answered questions about 'safe and unsafe places' in school



and the School Council are looking at the results and thinking of solutions for 'hot spots'



Finally, the week ended with a 'Blue Friday' when everyone came to school dressed in blue. This is to show that we want to say **'NO TO BULLYING'** in our school.
